




Evangelical faiths- all agreed that the use of nuclear weapons is morally unacceptable. But does this extend to their sole possession and not use?



"Due to the sound judgement of Kazuma Takashi and (other person) many lives were saved and they were killed in the line of duty. The staff of Eidan Subway Association hereby records their good work." He read this text on the small plaque at the Kasamigasaki station in Tokyo, which pays tribute to Kazuma Takahashi and one other subway employee. Most days Shinji could go without thinking of his dad, but today seeing the inscription transported him back to before that unfortunate day. Shinji's dad was a loving man, on most days he was more a friend to him than a father figure. It was only when Shinji acted out of line that he was scolded, and he experienced his dad's authority. The day before the incident had been one of those. He had wanted to go on a school trip to Hokkaido and his dad had adamantly refused. At this Shinji had thrown a tantrum, resulting in a fight with his dad.

March 20th, 1995; it was morning rush hour in Tokyo. In the city's subway cars, terrorists had leaked the deadly gas Sarin, killing thousands and injecting fear and panic in the minds of millions. Terrorists had dropped bags of Sarin in subway cars and popped them open with the tips of their umbrellas, subsequently escaping in getaway cars. His dad had picked up one of those bags in an attempt to get rid of it and it had let to his demise.
